SHOWTIME '76 Activity and publicity pay off for Edmonton bottle collectors' show

"...meanwhile **Jim Close [Charter Member]**, who volunteered to act as the first annual market and show chairman, was busy organizing his committee for the event..."

"...a call for vendors in Red Deer, Calgary and Edmonton and surrounding area, resulted in the booking of **62** eight-foot sales tables..."

"...March 28 saw a long line of people outside the West End Bingo Centre awaiting the 11:00 am opening. During a five-hour period, over 1300 paid admissions were received..."

"...people just looked about with amazement at the variety of items for sale. Nearly every type of antique or collectable was available, ranging from small furniture to art glass to bottles and tobacco tin..."

"...The displays were well received. They included such items as depression glass, merchants jugs and tins, food bottles, Chinese items, avons, lighting, and labeled beer druggist bottles, milks, and pops all from Alberta..."

"...Special displays included...the collectables of the Calgary brewing and Malting Co. and J. J. McLaughlin of Edmonton, the originator of Canada Dry..."



“...a special feature was a spinning and weaving demonstration by Trudie Lovegrove of the club...items donated for the show from the University of Alberta, Arts and Crafts Dept., the Alberta Sheep breeders and the Dept. of Agriculture...”

“...Among the visitors...were city aldermen, local and provincial archives and museum officials, and local historian authors.” [Great idea to invite VIPS!]
